

effective date of this act are transferred to the board of cosmetology established by this act.

Sec. 10. Current licensees; preserving causes of action

A. The board of cosmetology shall issue a license to any person who on the effective date of this act holds a valid license issued by the board of cosmetology in existence before the effective date of this act, on application and payment of the prescribed fee.

B. This act does not affect any cause of action arising under former title 32, chapter 5, Arizona Revised Statutes, repealed by this act or any rule promulgated pursuant to that chapter.

Sec. 11. Retroactivity

This act is effective retroactively to July 1, 1984.

VIETNAM VETERANS—MEMORIAL;
MEMORIAL BOARD AND FUND

CHAPTER 281

HOUSE BILL 2462

AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE GOVERNMENT; PROVIDING FOR AND PRESCRIBING DUTIES OF A VIETNAM VETERANS MEMORIAL BOARD; PROVIDING FOR A VIETNAM VETERANS MEMORIAL; PROVIDING FOR A VIETNAM VETERANS MEMORIAL FUND; PRESCRIBING INVESTMENT OF AND USE OF MONIES IN FUND, AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

Section 1. Vietnam veterans memorial board

A. A Vietnam veterans memorial board is established consisting of the director of the Arizona veterans' service commission, three members of the senate appointed by the president of the senate and three members of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives. If possible, the legislative members shall be Vietnam veterans. In addition, the president and the speaker shall each appoint to the board two private citizens who are Vietnam veterans.

B. The board shall choose a permanent chairman from among its members, except that the initial meeting shall be called and chaired by a legislative member designated by the president of the senate as chairman pro tempore. Thereafter, the board shall meet at the call of the permanent chairman.

C. Members of the board are not entitled to compensation for their services as such but are entitled to reimbursement from the Vietnam veterans memorial fund for reasonable expenses in traveling on and attending to official board business.

Sec. 2. Vietnam veterans memorial board; duties

The Arizona veterans' memorial board shall:

1. Plan and provide for the design, construction and dedication of a memorial to Arizona's Vietnam veterans to be placed in the Wesley Bolin

memorial plaza. The actual site for the memorial shall be selected with the approval of the department of administration.

2. Solicit designs and select the final design for the memorial according to published procedures and criteria. The design of the memorial shall be as politically neutral as possible with respect to the nature of the Vietnam conflict.

3. Solicit private monetary donations for deposit into the Vietnam veterans memorial fund.

4. Report biannually to the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives on the progress of the memorial.

Sec. 3. Vietnam veterans memorial fund; appropriation

A. A Vietnam veterans memorial fund is established. The fund shall consist of monies provided by appropriation or received as donations as provided for in this act. The state treasurer shall invest all monies in the Vietnam veterans memorial fund and any interest earned shall be deposited into the fund. The state treasurer shall administer the fund. The monies in the fund are exempt from section 35-190, Arizona Revised Statutes, relating to lapsing of appropriations, except that any such monies remaining unexpended or unencumbered in the fund on June 30, 1987 shall revert to the state general fund.

B. The cost and expenses authorized by this act shall be paid for by the state treasurer from the monies available in the Vietnam veterans memorial fund upon certification to the state treasurer by the chairman of the Vietnam veterans memorial board that the amount requested is owed for a valid purpose.

C. The sum of ten thousand dollars is appropriated in fiscal year 1984-1985 from the state general fund to the Vietnam veterans memorial fund as a loan for the purposes of this act. The state treasurer shall reimburse the amount of this appropriation from the first ten thousand dollars of donations deposited in the fund under this act.

Sec. 4. Termination; repeal

The Vietnam veterans memorial board terminates for all purposes and this act is repealed from and after December 31, 1987.

Sec. 5. Emergency

To preserve the public peace, health and safety it is necessary that this act become immediately operative. It is therefore declared to be an emergency measure, to take effect as provided by law.

RELATING TO EDUCATION; PRESCRIBING DUTIES OF SCHOOL DISTRICT GOVERNING BOARDS IN PROVIDING SPECIAL EDUCATION TO GIFTED PUPILS WHO MAY HAVE AN EDUCATIONAL DISADVANTAGE DUE TO A CERTAIN ENVIRONMENTAL BACKGROUND; PRESCRIBING REQUIREMENTS FOR PROGRAMS FOR GIFTED PUPILS; MAKING CONFORMING CHANGES, AND AMENDING SECTIONS 15-764 AND 15-769, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES.
